Summary of Special Package to Improve the Oxygen Production Capacity in Madhya Pradesh

1. Eligibility:

- 1.1. Micro, Small, Medium and Large greenfield industrial units in MP or; existing oxygen producing units in MP interested in capacity expansion or; existing units in MP willing to diversify in manufacturing / production of following products:
 - a) Oxygen Production
 - b) Oxygen Cylinder Manufacturers/ fabricators
 - c) Oxygen concentrator manufacturing units
 - d) Oxygen production related equipment/device manufacturer In order to qualify under capacity expansion/ diversification, existing large units need to commit at least 30% (minimum INR 10 Crore) of the investment made in pre-existing Plant and Machinery or INR 50 Crore, whichever is less. Prevalent definition of MSME department will be applicable for capacity expansion / diversification of MSME units.
- 1.2. Green field or pre-existing and operational medical colleges, hospitals and Nursing homes can avail the benefits under the provisions of special package provided they establish oxygen production units or oxygen cylinder manufacturing unit.
- 1.3. Oxygen producing units with minimum oxygen production capacity of 10 cubic meter per hour would be eligible to avail the incentives under the provision of special package.

2. Incentive Package for Eligible Units

- 2.1 Investment Promotion Assistance: Basic Investment assistance at a flat rate of 50% of the investment made in plant, machinery and building (excluding land and residential facilities); (cap of INR 75 Crore) 2.1.1 Units will get additional assistance under employment and export multiple as per Govt of MP order dated 17 January 2018
- 2.2 IPA can be availed in 5 equal yearly instalments for large units as per clause 3.3 of GoMP order dated 17/01/2018 in compliance with Gross Supply Multiple. MSME units can avail the incentives in 3 equal yearly instalments
- 2.2 Reimbursement of Expenditure incurred in Safety Standards: 50% (maximum of INR 1 crore) of the expenditure incurred by the eligible unit on safety standards such as firefighting equipment
- 2.3 Rebate in Power Tariff: Rebate of INR 1 per unit on prevailing power tariff. The rebate will be in addition to any rebate provided by MPERC. MPIDC or MSME department will reimburse this rebate. The rebate can be availed for 3 years from commercial date of production

3. Conditions for Special Financial Assistance

- 3.1 MPIDC will be responsible for the disposal of investment promotion assistance, under the mentioned special package, for units with investment in plant and machinery more than INR 10 Crore. The disposal will be as per the provisions and conditions mentioned in the Investment Promotion Policy 2014, amended from time to time
- 3.2 MSME Department will be responsible for the disposal of investment promotion assistance, under the mentioned special package, for units with investment in plant and machinery less than INR 10 Crore. The disposal will be as per the provisions and conditions mentioned in the prevailing Investment Promotion Policy of MSME department, amended from time to time

ORDER


Whereas, an Order of even number dated 23.03.2021 was issued for effective control of COVID-19 in the country, for a period upto 30.04.2021;

And whereas, considering the unprecedented surge in COVID-19 cases across the country, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW) vide DO No. Z.28015/85/2021-DM Cell dated 25th April 2021, has issued an advisory to all States and Union Territories (UTs), for implementing intensive, local and focused containment framework, in specific districts/ cities/ areas, identified based on a prescribed criterion;

Whereas, in exercise of the powers under section 6(2)(i) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) has directed the undersigned to issue an order, for ensuring compliance on the focused containment measures, as mentioned in the aforesaid MoHFW letter dated 25.04.2021, for containment of COVID-19 in the country;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers, conferred under Section 10(2)(1) of the Disaster Management Act 2005, the undersigned, hereby directs the State/ Union Territory Governments and State/ Union Territory Authorities to consider the containment measures for COVID-19, as conveyed vide aforesaid MoHFW advisory dated 25.04.2021, as per **Annexure-I**, for immediate implementation in their State/ UT, based on the assessment of the situation, until 31.05.2021. States/ UTs, will take the necessary containment measures, under the relevant provisions of the Disaster Management Act 2005. It is further directed that:

- (i) The National Directives for COVID-19 Management, as specified in **Annexure-II**, shall continue to be strictly followed throughout the country.
- (ii) All the District Magistrates shall strictly enforce the containment measures taken by States/ UTs and the National Directives.
- (iii) Any person violating these measures will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action under Section 188 of the IPC, and other legal provisions as applicable.
